Glaucoma Awareness

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National Glaucoma Awareness Month is observed in January. It's a time to raise awareness about glaucoma, a leading cause of blindness and vision loss, and to encourage individuals to get regular eye exams. Many people are unaware they have glaucoma until it's advanced, making early detection crucial.

More than 2.8 million Americans age 40 and older have glaucoma.

• Early Detection:

Glaucoma often has no early symptoms, so regular eye exams are essential for identifying it early, according to the National Eye Institute.

• Vision Loss Prevention:

The National Eye Institute emphasizes that early treatment can significantly reduce the risk of vision loss.

• Raising Awareness:

The month aims to educate the public about glaucoma, its risk factors, and the importance of regular eye exams.

• Family History:

If you have a family history of glaucoma, it's especially important to exercise, can also help reduce the risk of developing glaucoma get regular eye exams

Risk Factor Identification:

PCPs can assess patients for risk factors like family history, age (over 40), diabetes, and high blood pressure, which increase the likelihood of developing glaucoma.

• Referral to Specialists:

If risk factors are present or if symptoms are noticed, the PCP can refer the patient to an ophthalmologist or optometrist for a comprehensive eye exam, including tests for glaucoma.

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
